Minutes:

Supervisor Johnston made a motion to accept the minutes as written for the Regular Meeting on March 10, 2022 and the Treasure's Report for March 2022 seconded, by Supervisor Raudenbush, (MCU).

Reports:

Chairman Report — Update on WASD school tax issue it is now being perused by private residents as a class action lawsuit. Voted by a majority to add to the agenda follow up of part 2 of WASD tax issue. Supervisor Nissly motioned to contact the school district to begin the process of seceding from the district if we have the backing of the township residents seconded by Supervisor Raudenbush, (MCU).

Vice Chairman Report – ATV Ordinance update DCNR signs put up this week via resident volunteers. Will be conducting a drive around with CMATV/DCNR to confirm signage is compliant. Will expand the township web page ATC Ordinance with a link to supportive sub chapter codes Chapter 7722 of Title 75 regarding a legal ATV vehicle, driver safety and other relevant information. Riders need a valid driver's license, insurance financial ID card with VIN number and DCNR tag with current year sticker are required with a approve PA Dot helmet. County Zoning scheduling a meeting with David Hubbard, County Administrator to understand the zoning process. ERB Inspections Airbnb's compliance notification informing townships of the legal obligations of land owner's managing Air B n B's. 5 permits

Roadmaster Report – Working on potholes. Building roof has been repaired from ice damage over the winter. Shop drain has been repaired. Complaints about the Wilson Hill detour need to be addressed with PennDOT.

EMC – State weather training was held at the building May 3 with Debbie and IvaMae the township passed. Supervisor Johnston motioned to purchase a file cabinet for EMC records seconded by Supervisor Nissly, (MCU). Supervisor Raudenbush motioned to purchase an extra battery for the AED machine seconded by Supervisor Nissly, (MCU).

New Business: John Smay School House Lane as to why the township line sign was moved and part of road no longer maintained by the township will be looked into further and will get back to them. 2021 audit report was presented to Supervisors and the 2020 and 2021 state liquid fuels will be done on May 3 and 4. Lycoming County Planning Commission sub division the township has no comment. Supervisor Johnston motioned to advertise for the 2022 stone bid seconded by Supervisor Raudenbush, (MCU). County Aide applied for the year.

Old Business: English Run Road project will be advertised and bid out. Supervisor Johnston made a motion for the townships engineer McTish and Kunkle seconded by Supervisor Nissly to start that process (MCU). Supervisor Johnston made a motion to move ahead with finalizing the Driveway Ordinance and Driveway Permit seconded by Supervisor Nissly, (MCU). Supervisor Johnston made a motion to have Short Sock grade Wilson Hill Road and stone and to start applying EDP Oil on Wilson Hill Road and other township roads. seconded by Supervisor Nissly, (MCU). Voted by majority to add to agenda to have the townships engineer recheck township line and right away of School House Lane motioned by Supervisor Nissly, seconded by Supervisor Johnston, (MCU).
